REGULATION FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

- 1 These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
- [a] A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at.
- [b] Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
- 2 [a] No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
- [b] Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
- [a] operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
- [b] operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

- 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6 Any objection by an individual related by an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint

- 17 Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and dont's travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
- * When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- * If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- * The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- * Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- * When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- * Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so you dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded at show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

- 18. Not for competition entries will be accepted, see page 3 of this schedule.
- 19. Only dogs entered at the Show are allowed to attend.
- 20. <u>DOG FOULING</u> Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove immediately any fouling waste caused by their dog(s) and/or any grooming waste at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Any organisation holding a Kennel Club licensed event is required to provide an adequate number of receptacles for the disposal of such fouling.
- 21. The chalking, powdering or spraying (with the exception of water) of exhibits within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 22. All monies due to the Club, which remain unpaid, either unpaid fees or bank charges through dishonoured cheques, will be reported to the Scottish Kennel Club.
- 23. Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their appointment the Committee reserve to themselves the right to appoint another to fulfil the duty. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees will be returned.
- 24. The Committee are empowered to exclude any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition, either from disease, vice, natural or other cause, and if such exclusion takes place, either before or after judging, the entrance fee will be forfeited.
- 25. The entrance fee of a dog not brought will be forfeited.

Exhibitors are reminded that emergency exits and passageways leading to them must be kept clear at all times. Exhibitors should familarise themselves with the whereabouts of these exits. Should any incident occur which required the building to be evacuated, exhibits must obey instructions.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 The Show will open at 8.30 a.m.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- Judging will commence at 9.00 a.m. for Obedience and 9.30 a.m. for Breed.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- The entry fee shall be Members £4.00 per first entry per dog, Non-members £5.00 per first entry per dog, £2.00 each subsequent entry per dog. 'Not for Competition' £1.00 per dog. Catalogues are £2.50 prepaid, a limited number only, at £3.00, will be available on the day of the Show. Membership is £5.00 single, £7.50 joint, £2.00 junior. Senior Citizens £4.00 single, £5.50 joint.
- Prize money will not be paid.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition but may be entered 'Not for Competition' on the day of the Show. Members free, Non-members £1,00, entry forms at the door.
- 10 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 11. Where a Best Puppy in Show is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Similarly if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. Withdrawal from Competition Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however. must not compete in any subsequent competition. Proviso For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
- 12. The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition. Withdrawal from Other Competition Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition prior to the competition for Best in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Proviso For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten
- 13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14. No modification will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex b) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Authority To Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority To Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

NOVICE

- For dogs which have not won two First prizes in Obedience Classes (Beginners and Pre-beginners classes excepted)
- Handlers will not be penalised for encouragement or extra commands except in Sit and Down tests. In these tests at the discretion of the Judge, handlers may face their dogs. Judges or Stewards must not use the words 'Last Command' except in Sit and Down tests.
- The detailed test will be:
- [1] Temperament Test. To take place before heel on lead. Dogs to be on the lead, in the Stand position, handler to stand by the Dog. Judge to approach quietly from the front and to run his hand gently down the dog's back. Judge may talk quietly to the dog to reassure it. Any undue resentment, cringing, growling or snapping to be penalised. This is not a stand for examination or stay test. 10 points 15 points

Heel on Lead

Heel Free 20 points Recall from Sit and Down position at handlers choice. Dogs to be recalled by Handler when stationary and facing dog. Dog to return smartly to the Handler, sit in front, go to heel - all on command of Judge or Steward to Handler. Distance at discretion of the Judge. Test

commences when handler leaves the Dog 10 points

Retrieve a dumb-bell. Handlers may use their own dumb-bell 15 points Sit one minute, handler in sight 10 points

Down two minutes, handler in sight 20 points TOTAL 100 points

CLASS A

For dogs which have not won three First prizes in Class A, B and Open Class C in total.

Simultaneous command and signal will be permitted. Extra commands and signals must be penalised.

The detailed test will be:

Heel Free 30 points

Recall from Sit and Down position at handlers choice. Dogs to be recalled to heel by Handler on command of Judge or Steward whilst Handler is walking away from the dog, both to continue forward until ordered to halt. The recall and halt points to be the same for each dog and handler. Test commences following handler's last command to the dog. 15 points

Retrieve a dumb-bell. Handlers may use their own dumb-bell 25 points Sit two minutes, handler in sight 20 points

[10] Down three minutes, handler out of sight

30 points [11] Scent discrimination. The handlers scent on a marked cloth provided by the Judge There must be a total of six scent cloths, this total must not include any decoys, but must

include the cloth provided by the Judge. These six cloths must be set out in a straight line which may be in any direction

[12] TOTAL

30 points 150 points

CLASS B

- For dogs which have not won three First prizes in Class B and Open Class C in total.
- One command by word or signal is permitted, any extra commands and signals must be penalised. However, a simultaneous command and signal is permitted in the Send Away element of the Send Away, Drop and Recall exercise.
- The detailed test will be:
- Heel Free. The dog shall be required to walk at heel free and shall also be tested at fast and slow pace. Each change of pace shall commence from the halt position.

40 points

- [2] Send Away, Drop and Recall. On command of Judge the Handler to bring the dog to the place indicated, set up the dog and stand upright. On further command, the handler will send the dog in the direction indicated by the Judge. After the dog has been dropped, handler will call the dog to heel whilst walking where directed by the Judge and both will continue forwarad until ordered to halt. No obstacle may be placed in the path of the dog. Markers. if used, must be stationary and contain no moving parts. Simultaneous command and signal is permitted but as soon as the dog leaves the handler, the arm must be dropped. (N.B. and extra command may be simultaneous command and signal but must be penalised) 40 points
- Retrieve any one article provided by the Judge but which must not be in any way injurious to the dog (excluding food or glass). The article to be picked up easily by any breed of dog in that Class and to be clearly visible to the dog. A separate similar article to be used for each dog. Test commences following Judge or Stewards words 'last command' to handler. 30 points
- Sit two minutes, handler out of sight

20 points 30 points

Down five minutes, handler out of sight

Scent discrimination. The handlers scent on a marked cloth provided by the Judge. There must be a minimum of six and up to a maximum of ten scent cloths, the total must include one decoy cloth, and the cloth provided by the Judge. These pattern of cloths is at the Judge's discretion.

[12] TOTAL

40 points 200 points

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seven days before the day of closing of POSTAL entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. Wednesday 27th April 2016.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes. wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

1) Withdrawal - The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations

Transfer - all f a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class. Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

b] If an exhibit entered incorrectly in a minor puppy class, puppy class or junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age. 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the puppy class, Junior class or yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no puppy, junior or yearling class to the open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. cl For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dog of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of

PUPPY: For dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING: For dogs of TWELVE and not exceeding twentyfour calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not
